People are drawn to places of worship. We long to come together and join with others in mutual admiration of something grand. In our modern world many travel to worship at a sports stadium, others travel to pay homage at Bourbon Street, while still others may go and offer their praises at a comic book or superhero convention. But these modern-day pilgrimages cannot hold a candle to the journeys that Christians have been making for millennia to holy sites around the world. Canterbury, Rome, Jerusalem, Santiago de Compestela, Lourdes, Tepeyac Hill, and others have received millions, if not

billions in some cases, of pilgrims over the centuries and they all seek an audience with the Holy One. Now, in this Season of Lent, we begin our pilgrimage to the Cross. What will we find? What will we lose? "Once a man was asked, 'what did you gain by regularly praying to God?' The man replied, 'nothing...but let me tell you what I lost: Anger, ego, greed, depression, insecurity, fear of death.' Sometimes the answer to our prayers is not gaining but losing; which ultimately is the gain." The final goal of Lent is to take a few steps closer to Jesus and wrap our arms around Him. But we cannot wrap our arms around Jesus when they are filled with baggage. We must empty

our arms in order to fill them with God. How do we do this? By realizing that God is more fulfilling than the junk we carry around. God is better than anger, He is greater than depression, He is ultimate embodiment of all human desire. Once we grasp that Jesus is what we really need then we will see the necessity of letting go of our baggage. Unfortunately, books, sermons and church attendance can only get you so far. You must speak with God and spend time in His Presence. The good news is that God can be found just about anywhere. Seek Him in the church, in the garden, on a walk, on a bike ride, while doing your favorite hobby. God is with you, waiting expectantly for



you to speak to Him. If a pilgrim does not look at a map once and a while she will become lost and if we do not look to Christ we too will become lost. Keep your eyes on the Lord, walk towards Him, drop your baggage, and embrace Jesus our Savior, Redeemer, and Friend. I pray that this Lent will find you both losing and gaining all to the glory of Christ.

Below are some condensed notes from the Word Cloud and Listening Post research that we felt important to share with all.

Good Preacher - Bill Waln

A good preacher uses the lectionary and is able to connect historical perspective to the here and now.

He/she provides a well prepared, relatively brief (10 -15 min.) solid message that is delivered with passion and spirituality to inspire, uplift, and motivate people.

A good preacher often challenges the listener and is able to use humor to relate to people.

Community Minded – Sharon Hixson

A community minded rector knows and appreciates our community.

He/she is familiar with what is going on and is comfortable putting him/herself "out there", being visible and willing to join in.

He/she is confident, outgoing, friendly, sociable, and kind.

He/she is willing to join civic groups, attend local non-church related events and write the occasional newspaper column.

Well Educated – Mike Torrence

A well-educated rector is well based in theology but able to bring it to our level and help us understand and apply it.

Being well-educated also means that he/she is "people smart", appreciates the value of our small town and is skillful at counseling.

Open Minded – Bob Summers

An open-minded rector remembers that we are all God's children and should be tolerant and non-judgmental.

He/she should be welcom-

ing with no exclusions.

Will Grow the Church – Amy Long

A rector who will grow the church is a person who

is willing and able to be an active and visible part of our local community him/herself.

He/she is a good leader, open and warm, who consistently works hard to get to know us personally and can identify potential among us as individuals.

He/she is capable of empowering/encouraging us to reach out and express or use our own talents to help grow the church.

Although open to new ideas, he/she also demonstrates a respect and appreciation for the liturgy and worship style of our church.

Emphasis on Children and Youth and Relating to All Ages – Kyle Parks

A rector who values an emphasis on children and youth should be open to offering more contemporary services designed to draw youth.

He/she should be comfortable providing opportunities for youth to become involved in current services.

He/she should be a welcoming person who can relate to youth and recognize the needs of **all ages** within the congregation.

He/she should know the importance of study groups for all ages and be able to delegate important tasks relating to youth to a youth minister.

Please continue to pray as we move thru this process. We understand the feeling of anxiousness surrounding this, as we feel the same thing. Your patience and faith are important for this journey we are walking together.


